<b>Aldi</b>	8am to 9pm from Monday to Saturday, and 11am to 5pm on Sundays.	N/A	Restrictions in place which allows customers to buy only four of any one product.
<b>Asda</b>	Temporarily closing its 24 hour stores between 12am and 6am	Only opening their stores to the elderly and vulnerable before 9am	The supermarket confirmed via Twitter that customers would now be able to buy up to three of any product across all food items, toiletries and cleaning products.
<b>COOP</b>	Usually open 7am-10pm	N/A	To make sure there's enough for everyone in your community we're limiting selected products to 2 per person.
<b>Iceland</b>	Typically open from 8am-7pm	Each day, elderly shoppers can visit between 8am - 9am to get their shopping first	
<b>LIDL</b>	Typically 8am-10pm Mon to Fri and 10am-4pm Sat and Sun	N/A	Quantities may be restricted to 6 items per customer
<b>Morrisons</b>		N/A	Morrisons has also increased the amount of stock being sent to stores from warehouses, extended home delivery service and introduced temporary purchase limits on products where there is high demand.  This will mean there will be more slots available to customers, there will be a call centre for people without access to online shopping and a new range of simple-to-order food parcels from March 23.
<b>Sainburys</b>	Typically open from 7am - 10pm from Monday to Saturday.  Stores open from 10am to 4pm on Sundays.	The first hour of opening to be for elderly or vulnerable customers	From Monday 23rd March, our online customers who are over 70 years of age or have a disability will have priority access to online delivery slots. We will contact these customers in the coming days with more details. For any online customer who can travel to our stores, from Monday 23rd March, we will operate an expanded 'click and collect' service. We are significantly increasing the number of collection sites across the country over the coming days in preparation for this. Customers can place their order online as usual and pick it up from a collection point in the store car park. We believe this will also work for people who are self-isolating. From tomorrow, Wednesday 18th March, customers will be able to buy a maximum of three of any grocery product and a maximum of two on the most popular products including toilet paper, soap and UHT milk.
<b>Tesco</b>	Usually open 7am-10pm	To ensure our more vulnerable and elderly customers can shop in-store, we will prioritise one hour every Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning between 9-10am (except in our Express stores).	To help free up slots for the more vulnerable, such as our elderly customers and those who are self-isolating, we are encouraging customers who shop online or choose Click+Collect for their grocery home shopping, to prioritise shopping in-store where possible.
