Data challenge. Recommendations of report approved. That is to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Note the breadth of work driven by the Leeds Palliative Care network including the work of the Dying Matters Partnership • Recognise people receiving palliative care and those at end of life as a key priority population in city plans • Provide feedback on the draft population level outcomes for people at end of life, and on further engagement • Provide feedback on the draft Leeds Palliative and End of Life Framework. Point made to link into children’s agenda and carers and “think family” <p>Leeds carers partnership strategy presented. Need stakeholders to commit within their organisations to make life better for carers. Carers need support, keep things simple, join up services. Carers Leeds endorses the strategy. Point made that we should have already addressed the issues in the strategy so why haven’t we been successful.</p> <p>C & YPMHWB – future in mind. Annual plan refreshed. Recommendations approved. Questions asked about links to education and doing the right thing. Points made about how innovative can we be and as a system what are we prepared to give up to fund more investment in children’s services!</p> <p>Leeds Plan. Update, discuss with partners Sept/Oct. The left-shift. I do feel there is some difference of opinion of what this means and therefore what we should be measuring and how will we know if we are successful</p> <p>WYHPlan – draft shared. Need to narrow down to 6 key targets Hannah confirmed that conversations with WY public showed they wanted a focus on mental health.</p> <p>CQC system review – action plan all green or amber and no reds. Bring back in 6 months to see where we are with this.</p>
