Help to Claim Resources in 14 languages

New video service for deaf claimants accessing Universal Credit

Universal Credit claimants can now access British Sign Language interpreters as part of a free video relay service. The Video Relay Service (VRS), allows users to make BSL interpreted video calls via their tablet, smartphone, computer or laptop. A professional interpreter then relays the call in English to a member of DWP staff.

The service, which is already available for people accessing other disability benefits and the Access to Work scheme, will be available through GOV.UK. More information is available here.
