Men's Health Unlocked - Damian Dawtry



Damian gave an update on Men's Health Unlocked, a new city-wide network focused on tackling men's health inequalities.

LCH Third Sector Strategy - Callum Dixon



The Leeds Community Healthcare NHS Trust (LCH) [Third Sector Strategy](#) was launched in September with great participation from across the Health & Care sector. A steering group has since been formed, focused on action to take forward.

Steering group member Callum Dixon, GIPSIL, gave an overview of the first meeting, which looked at how to prioritise objectives for the first year, and how they can be translated into tangible initiatives/proposals/requirements.

Caroline Schonrock from LCH joined the meeting. In addition to engagement, LCH is also interested to collaborate around the NHS Charities Together.


Update on the State of the Sector report - Pip Goff

Pip provided an overview of the report findings, undertaken to understand the size and shape of the Third Sector in Leeds so we have a benchmark for defining who and what we are, and are able to talk more confidently about it. It links strongly with the Third Sector Resilience survey work led by Voluntary Action Leeds.

There are a number of key headlines from the report which demonstrate the huge diversity of the Third Sector in Leeds.

The report will be launched, and we encourage everyone to talk about and share it amongst other data we have. The more data & information that we can use to showcase the strength of the sector, the better.

Shaping our Future - Rach Stanton



Rach gave an update on how the Shaping our Future work is progressing, further to the [report](#) presented at the last meeting. Consultation has continued to take place, and shifts in health structures and announcements have been made, with a number of developments in the pipeline.

Shaping Our Future is moving forward, looking at how we can offer support & capacity building mechanisms to make us sector-ready for new commissioning approaches across the city.

A number of elements we'll be focusing on including generous leadership, representation/influencing, communications and cultural shift.

Pip gave an overview of the West Yorkshire and Harrogate Integrated Care Partnership context, which is changing very quickly. We are trying to ensure that through the work we have been doing alongside and on behalf of the sector our members and potential members - especially smaller organisations - are well-positioned.

Leeds partners are starting to look at how new structures could look alongside national consultation happening around the future of Integrated Care Systems. Likely that CCG function will be devolved to local providers and West Yorkshire & Harrogate. What does that mean for us locally?

A paper went to West Yorkshire & Harrogate this week that outlines local thinking. Work is in progress and we will continue to make sure you are

engaged and voices are heard. None of it can be done without work you all do and we need to make sure there is a fair & transparent system.
