This weekly intelligence report brings together all the insight and engagement happening across the city to work with communities and understand their approaches to the vaccine. Sources include the Leeds City Council Community Champions programme, the Forum Central Communities of interest network, the outbreak management third sector partners, VAL Leeds Voices community work and the Healthwatch Weekly Check In, as well as wider intelligence gathered by the People's Voices Group partners - a big thank you to everyone who has contributed and continues to share the surveys and feedback.

#### **Covid Vaccination Update:**

The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) confirmed that there have been no specific safety concerns identified with any COVID-19 vaccine in relation to pregnancy. The JCVI is therefore advising that <u>pregnant women should be offered the vaccine</u> at the same

time as the rest of the population, based on their age and clinical risk group.

### Up-to-date shielding guidance in community languages

The advice to shield from home has now been paused as of 31 March. There is still a range of help and support available to people who are Clinically Extremely Vulnerable in Leeds.
