Latest COVID position

Stacey gave an overview of the current position of cases and the vaccination roll out.

Introductions/check ins

Stacey-FC

The next phase of Covid-19 funding for priority areas with vaccine hesitancy is being rolled out, focusing in priority areas with vaccine hesitancy.

The first area is HATCH PCN. The grants are of £500 for key vaccine messages and £1500 for capacity building.

Jessalyn- LCC Personalised Care/Shared Decision Making (SDM)

You can find the **the presentation here** and focuses on:

- Defining what personalised care and health literacy are and highlights existing health inequalities
- LCC partners with Healthwatch and want to understand more about:
 - how to support people to better understand the information they receive,
 - be confident to talk to professionals about health and care,
 - be more engaged in decisions about their health

- Aim: support people to be confident and actively engage in their care, before, during and after appointments
- Action: develop resources, organise campaigns to raise awareness, embed materials sent in advance to an appointment, promote "WHAT MATTERS TO ME" questions

Gabby/Stacey

Both presented information of the new Allyship model between senior leaders and the COI network.

Sarah-FC

Discussions on the hybrid mode of working, having appointments, activities in the future: both face-to-face and virtually. Encouraging people to contribute with their views and opinions on what they need.

The aim is to create a resource and run a big event with case studies and people coming to share their views and learn from each other.

People are welcomed to come with suggestions at the next COI meeting, also share their experiences and the challenges they have faced so far.

<u>Toshal</u>

Having both face-to-face and online activities with the communities such as morning coffee outdoor meetings.

All community centres are open for activities face-to-face and they have organised activities with children and learning disability groups.

Reported considerably less online activities because the community feels more confident to come back face-to-face especially because of the high vaccine uptake.

Home visits have started for people really needing them.

Emily- Women Unlocked

Setting up a women only vaccination clinic for culturally diverse women. It is a walk-in centre. It will be from 24th to 28th of May at the Reginald Centre. Will share more information when ready.

Rachel- Carers Leeds

Piloting indoor and outdoor face to face support and preparing for the new stage of the roadmap on 17 May.

Good uptake of the vaccine for carers.

<u>Jen</u>

Reviewing social distancing and face-to-face activities and encouraging the outdoor activities.

Continuous hesitancy amongst young people.

50%-60% of staff had their first vaccine.

Reported anxiety for coming out of lockdown and having to attend activities with more people.

Delays in getting LF tests as an organisation.

Huma-CCG

Encourage people to share their vaccine experience <u>through their survey</u>. Over 10,000 people participated so far. Their views have been collected and some changes have been made to the clinics from the feedback.

Zaira- FC

Sensory and Digital Inclusion Network.

International day of disabled people is coming up.
