At 11:15am In the Brodrick Hall at Leeds City Museum people will make speeches.

These will be signed in British Sign Language (BSL).

12.30 to 1 PM and 2 to 2.30 PM - Performances



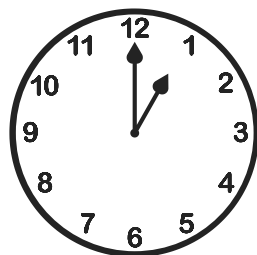
People will perform at two points during the day.

An exhibition by autistic artists and artists with learning disabilities is in the Thoresby Room.

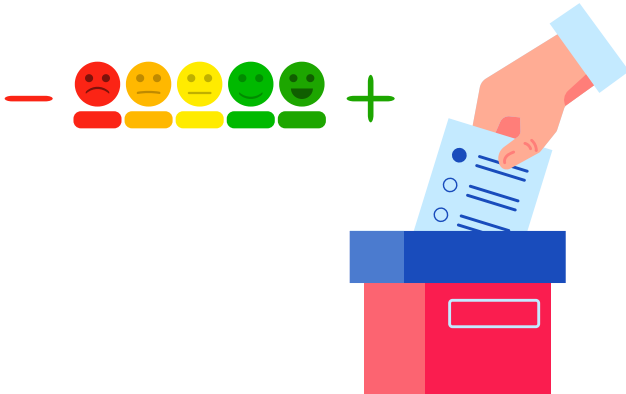
You can do some drawing and writing on a big art work. This is a fun space for you to be playful and creative.
